The data indicate that improvements can continue to be made in delivery and rapport with the audience. Visual design and the use of supporting material will continue to improve this year, as well as all the other items: organization, language, and central message. According to the rubric criteria, delivery can continue improve by ensuring the speaker does not appear tentative and students can improve their connections to the audience through better eye contact.

The BA 299 curriculum will continue to improve in 2024-2025 by adding more emphases on oral communication skills. Oral presentation coaching will continue with a focus on delivery, visual design, supporting material, and rapport with the audience.

The oral communication goal was met with 97% of the student scoring at least a 15 on the scoring rubric. The data indicate that improvements can continue to be made in delivery and rapport with the audience. This is an improvement over last year when 87% of the student scored at least a 15 on the scoring rubric. The writing component will be assessed during the 2024-2025 academic year.
